- There are <u>3</u> Greek words that translate into the English word "love".
- First is <u>"Eros"</u> which is the sexual type of love.
- Second is <u>"Philia"</u> which means a brotherly type of love.
- The primary word for love throughout the New Testament is <u>"Agape"</u> which means a sacrificial type of love towards someone else.
- Agape is the <u>primary</u> form of love in the Bible.
- God is the author and originator of this kind of <u>sacrificial</u> posture towards others.
- The very <u>essence</u> of God is sacrificial love.
- In 1 John 4:9 John writes that God loved us first. We <u>respond</u> to His act of love.
- 1 John 4:11 says we ought to respond to God's love "...we also ought to love <u>one</u> <u>another</u>."
- You need God to <u>share</u> His heart with you to love like this.
- Agape love does not have <u>conditions</u>.
- In Luke 6 Jesus is very clear that it is not enough to love people whom you like.
  You are to love people you <u>don't</u> like.
