- Even those with the strongest faith need reassurance sometimes.
- In 1 John 5:14, John says "if you ask anything according to <u>God's</u> <u>will</u>, He hears you."
- · Jesus teaches two things about praying:
  - Don't pray to be <u>seen</u> by others.
  - Don't think the more <u>flowery</u> the prayer the better.
- As Methodists we believe in free will. We believe God gives room for our wills to impact the world.
- In the Lord's Prayer, Jesus tells us to pray for God's Will to be <u>worked</u> <u>out</u> around us.
- It is through <u>prayer</u> that you <u>surrender</u> over your version of life for God's version.
- When you seek God out... telling God what you <u>need</u> but asking for His Will to ultimately be done... over time what you <u>want</u> becomes what God wants.
- John Wesley says, "Faith <u>anticipates</u> the blessings."
- Asking for something by invoking the name of Jesus is the same as praying in <u>alignment</u> with God's Will.
- In James 4:3, Jesus' brother writes "When you ask, you do not receive, because you ask with <u>wrong motives</u>, that you may spend what you get on your pleasures."
- Peace, assurance, strength, endurance, forgiveness, and mercy are always part of God's Will on earth as it is in heaven.
